HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) is a virus that can cause AIDS (acquired immunodeficiency syndrome), a disease characterized by the immune system failure that eventually leads to death. HIV tests should be offered to everyone and should be mandatory, especially in high risk areas, such as Africa and Southeast Asia. It is necessary to care for the vulnerable population using our state-of-the-art treatment and also provide education to prevent further transmission of HIV.¹

It is important for the high risk population to receive mandatory tests that will enable early detection of the virus and lead to more effective treatment. Studies suggest that as little as 1% of adult populations in Africa are tested for HIV, and in rural areas with little access to medical technology, this figure could be even less.¹ There are far few people who are receiving counseling. Since testing is the very first step in detecting the virus, it is important for the sexually active population to get tested on a regular basis and receive treatment before transmission to another individual occurs.¹

Vulnerable populations, such as pregnant women and their babies, should also get tested regularly. Children of women with HIV usually become infected during pregnancy or during breastfeeding.² HIV tests should be mandatory during an expectant mother's regular prenatal check-ups.¹

More importantly, however, people should be educated about the dangers and risks of HIV. Learning methods to prevent high risk behavior is one important way to reduce the spread of HIV. Regular HIV testing and updated information about HIV actively communicated to the public should decrease the transmission of the virus.¹

A complete cure for HIV has not been found yet, and we should do as much as we can to avoid the spread of this virus. Making the HIV tests mandatory for high risk and vulnerable populations and providing them with updated HIV information are efforts that will greatly help reduce the transmission of HIV.¹
